September 30, 2023, marks the 10th anniversary of Orange Shirt Day (OSD). How will you honour residential school survivors during this significant moment in history?

Digital Human Library (DHL), together with the International Indigenous Speakers Bureau (IISB) invite people worldwide to listen and learn from Phyllis Webstad's Orange Shirt story during IISB's <u>#OSD10for10 Campaign</u>. The campaign aims to have 10% of households view and listen to how Orange Shirt Day came to be.
