The Provincial Executive approved a resolution to move the presentation of



the Student Citizenship Awards from the annual convention to its own separate awards program. Additional adjustments were made to the criteria for eligibility, but the awards will continue to honour Manitoba's young people in public schools and their accomplishments. The inaugural presentations will be made at the local school level at a meaningful time (school assembly or graduation exercises, etc.) to enable family, friends, and school community members to be present.

The <u>awards package</u> contains an overview of the updated 2024 awards program along with criteria for eligibility and the selection process. Only Manitoba high school students in grades 9 to 12 at a public school can apply. The deadline to receive nominations is 4:30 p.m. on Friday, April 5.
