

TREATY No.1 & No.2 INFORMATION SHEET



Treaty No. 1 was entered into on *August 3, 1871* at Lower Fort Garry. The “Stone Fort Treaty” is between Queen Victoria (as represented by the Dominion of Canada through Lieutenant-Governor Adams G. Archibald and Commissioner Wymiss M. Simpson) and the Anishinaabeg and Ininiwak.

Treaty No.2 was entered into on *August 21, 1871* at Manitoba House. The “Manitoba Post Treaty” is between Queen Victoria (as represented by the Dominion of Canada through Lieutenant-Governor Adams G. Archibald and Commissioner Wymiss M. Simpson) and the Anishinaabeg.

Treaties No.1 & No.2 were amended by an Order-in-Council on *April 30, 1875* to include provisions orally promised but not written into the text of the Treaty and the annuity was increased from \$3.00 to \$5.00 as compensation. Also in 1875, the Portage Band was divided into three First Nations – Long Plain, Sandy Bay, and Swan Lake.

TREATY No.3 INFORMATION SHEET

Treaty No.3 was entered into on *October 3, 1873* at the North West Angle of Lake of the Woods. The “North West Angle Treaty” is between Queen Victoria (as represented by the Dominion of Canada through Lieutenant-Governor Alexander Morris, Commissioner J.A.N. Provencher, and Commissioner S.J. Dawson) and the Anishinaabeg.

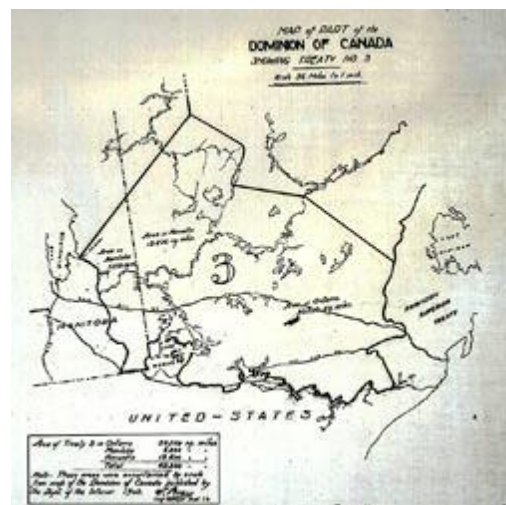
Treaty No.3 adhesions were entered into on *October 13, 1875* at North West Angle; *September 12, 1875* at Fort Francis which included Metis; and *June 9, 1875* at Lac Seul.

TREATY No.4 INFORMATION SHEET

Treaty No. 4 was entered into on *September 15, 1874* at Fort Qu'Appelle and *September 21, 1874* at Fort Ellice. The “Qu’Appelle Treaty” is between Queen Victoria (as represented by the Dominion of Canada through Lieutenant-Governor Alexander Morris, Minister David Laird, and Commissioner William Christie) and the Anishinaabeg and Nēhiyawak/Ininiwak.

Treaty No.4 adhesions were entered into on *September 8 and 9, 1875* at Qu'Appelle Lakes; *September 24, 1875* at Swan Lake, SK; *August 24 1876* at Fort Pelly; and *September 25, 1877* at Fort Walsh.

TREATY No.5 INFORMATION SHEET

Treaty No.5 was entered into on *September 20, 1875* at Beren's River, *September 24, 1875* at Norway House, *September 27, 1875* at Grand Rapids, and *September 28, 1875* at Wapang. The "Lake Winnipeg Treaty" is between Queen Victoria (as represented by the Dominion of Canada through Lieutenant-Governor Alexander Morris and Commissioner James McKay) and the Anishinaabeg and Nēhiyawak/Ininiwak.

Treaty No.5 adhesions were entered into on *July 26, 1876* at Wa-Pang/Dog-Head Island; *August 4, 1876* at Beren's River; *September 7, 1876* at Winnipeg; *September 7, 1876* at the Pas; *June 26, 1908* at Split Lake; *July 8, 1908* at Norway House; *July 15, 1908* at Cross Lake; *July 30, 1908* at Nelson House; *August 24, 1908* at Fisher River; *July 29, 1909* at Oxford House; *August 6, 1909* at God's Lake; *August 13, 1909* at Island Lake; *June 9, 1910* at Fort Churchill; and *August 10, 1910* at York Factory.

TREATY No.6 INFORMATION SHEET

Treaty No.6 was entered into on *August 23, 1876* at Fort Carlton and *August 28, 1876* at Fort Pitt. This Treaty is between Queen Victoria (as represented by the Dominion of Canada through Lieutenant Governor Alexander Morris, Commissioners James McKay and William Christie) and the Anishinaabeg and Nēhiyawak/Ininiwak.

Treaty No.6 adhesions were entered into on *August 9, 1877* at Fort Pitt; *August 21, 1877* at Fort Edmonton; *September 25, 1877* at Blackfoot Crossing (Bow River); *August 19, 1878* at an unknown location; *August 29, 1878* at Battleford; *September 3, 1878* at Fort Carlton; *September 18, 1878* at Edmonton; *July 2, 1879* at Fort Walsh; *December 8, 1882* at Fort Walsh; *February 11, 1889* at Montreal Lake; *August 10, 1898* at Pukatawagan; *May 25, 1944 & May 13, 1950* at Rocky Mountain House; *November 21, 1950* at Witchehan Lake; and *August 18, 1954 & May 15, 1956* at Cochin.

Treaty No.10 was entered into on *August 28, 1906* at Ile-a-la Cross and *September 19, 1906* at Canoe Lake. This Treaty is between King Edward VII (as represented by the Dominion of Canada through Commissioners James A. McKenna and Thomas A. Borthwick) and the Denesuline and Nēhiyawak/Ininiwak.

Treaty No.10 adhesions were entered into on *August 19 and 22, 1907* at Lac Brochet.
